OMEGA TO AWARD \$10,000 GRANT TO CLEARWATER

Omega Breaks New Ground by Offering its First Annual Leadership in Sustainable Education Award

HUDSON VALLEY, NY, June 8, 2012 – Omega Institute, home of the award-winning Omega Center for Sustainable Living (OCSL), today announced the creation of a new annual award to acknowledge nonprofit peers who exemplify leadership in sustainable education, and who share Omega's commitment to building a more just and sustainable world.
