

Course # 4605-804 September 12-17, 2021 East Meets West: Chinese & Watercolor Painting Lian Zhen

Faculty asks that you bring the following supplies with you to the course:

- Brushes: Synthetic and / or Black Velvet brushes.
 - Round number 4, 6 & 8, get two of each
 - Pointed number 2, 3, one or two of each
 - Flat one or two ¼ inch (with wedge shape at end of handle for applying masking such as Winsor & Newton aquarelle brushes), two ½ inch and a 1 inch.

• Colors (tubes):

Three tubes of the primary colors. One from each of the three groups of primary colors; Other similar primary colors are OK:

- Blue Antwerp (Winsor & Newton), Prussian or Phthalocyanine Blue Red Shade (M. Graham & Co.);
- Yellow Hansa, Azo Light (M. Graham & Co.), Winsor (Winsor & Newton), Arylide (DVP), Bumblebee or Aureoine (American Journey).
- Red Pyrrol, Napthal (M. Graham & Co.), Winsor (Winsor & Newton), Joe's Red (American Journey).

• Paper:

Half sheets (15"x22", or 16"x20") 140 lb Cold Press watercolor papers, Arches or Kilimanjaro, NO EXCEPTIONS. A 5-day workshop needs 3.

• Palette:

One large size palette like John Pike Watercolor palette (**not little ones**; large white color plate is OK).

• Masking Fluid:

A new bottle of light colored art-masking fluid. If Cheap Joe's (Cheapjoes.com) does not have them buy from Amazon.com. Recommended:

- Art Masking Fluid by U.S. Art Supply (Amazon.com has it)
- Shiva Liquid Masque by Richson Mediums
- o Winsor & Newton's yellowish color masking

• Other:

- 1 plywood board or gatorboard size about 16"x23" for taping down the watercolor paper, (half sheet)
- 3 small dishes for making color liquids
- 1 roll of masking tape or clear packing tape
- 2 sheets of graphite papers (transfer paper, erasable)
- Hair dryer
- A medium size water sprayer
- An apron
- o 3 sheets of tracing papers size about 15"x12"
